	Computing	Spreadsheets The children will look at a range of spreadsheets and learn to open, save and edit them They will learn to copy, cut and paste in spreadsheets and use tools to automatically total rows and columns. Children will then use spreadsheets to solve mathematical puzzles including money.	
	DT	Puppets The children will have the opportunity to learn about how different puppets work and will have a chance to create a puppet linking to our history topic of Victorian seaside!	
	Science	The children will revisit and review a range of science topics they have learnt in science throughout the year. They will also use their working scientifically skills to investigate and research.	Commutativity and Inverse The children will learn that addition and multiplication calculations can be completed in any order, however, subtraction and division calculations cannot be. They will also learn the inverse of each calculation and how to use these to check their work.  Place Value The children will recap and consolidate their place value learning from earlier on in the year, including representing and partitioning numbers up to 100 as well as starting to think about numbers beyond 100.
	Music	Reflect, Rewind, and Replay The children will listen and appraise a range of classical music and will learn to improvise and compose their own rhythms and tunes.
